Mixed Mini fortune

Britain's most successful rally car - the Mini - made a brave showing at the last British Rally of the century. Only four Minis entered and two completed the event.

he Mini 1.3i GPA car of The Milli 1.31 G. . . . Terry Colley and Dave Lucas was the top Mini finisher, completing the rally in 86th overall and fourth in class A5. The only other Mini to make it home to Rally HQ in Cheltenham was run by a Japanese team, with Shinobu Kitani and Makoto Mizoi at the helm. Remarkably, their own Mini was transported to Britain from Japan to take part in the event and finished a respectable 89th overall, 6th in the N1 class.

International rally veteran

Trevor Godwin, who has competed on the 'RAC Rally' a number of times in his Horiba-supported Mini, retired from the 1999 event at the end of the second day. His 1.3i Mini made it to Stage 12, Sweet Lamb, when a suspension component broke - he suspects it was a front Hi-Lo. This wasn't terminal but significantly lowered the height and handling of the car. After twice being thrown off the forest tracks of the stage, Trevor and co-driver Rick Spurgeon were forced

to call it a day, parking up next to the stricken SEAT of Toni Gardemeister.

"We were only a mile from the end of the stage," explains Trevor. "But it was uphill all the way to the finish from there, and the sump guard was dragging on the ground. Last year we stopped alongside car 17 and this year it was number 10, so we're moving up the order..."

At the time, Trevor was lying 3rd in class A5 and thoroughly enjoying himself. "I've finished this rally before Tetsuya Aikoh, ret
